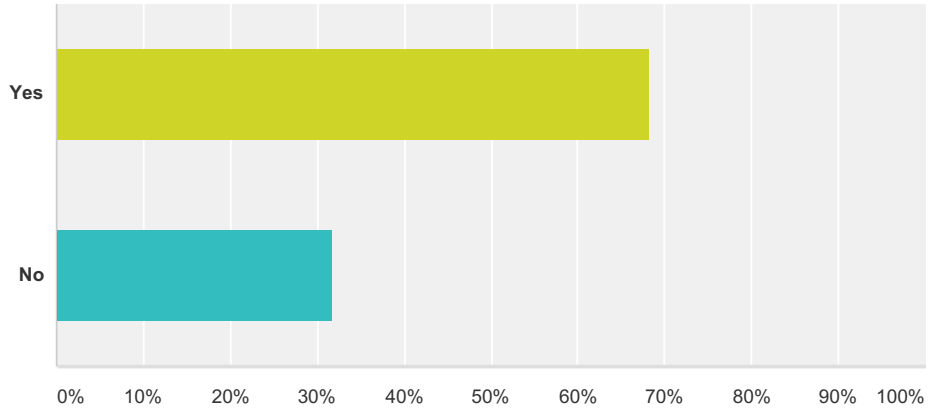


**Q1 Do you feel it is necessary to have email listserv for the purposes of discussion among members of the Progressive Caucus?**

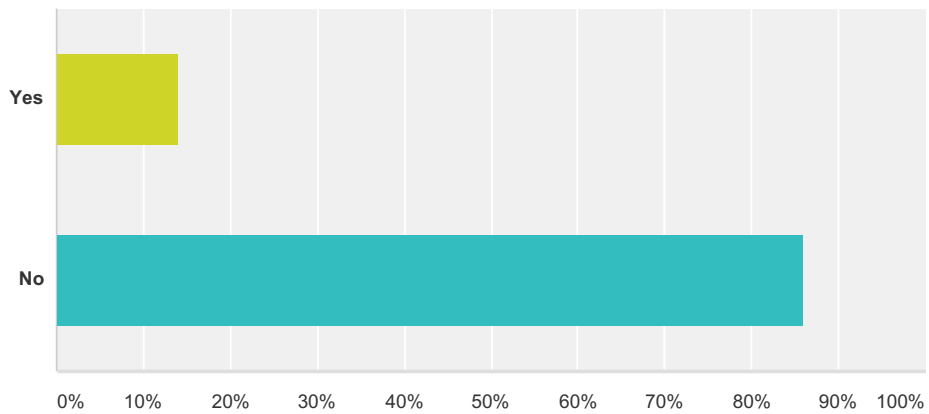

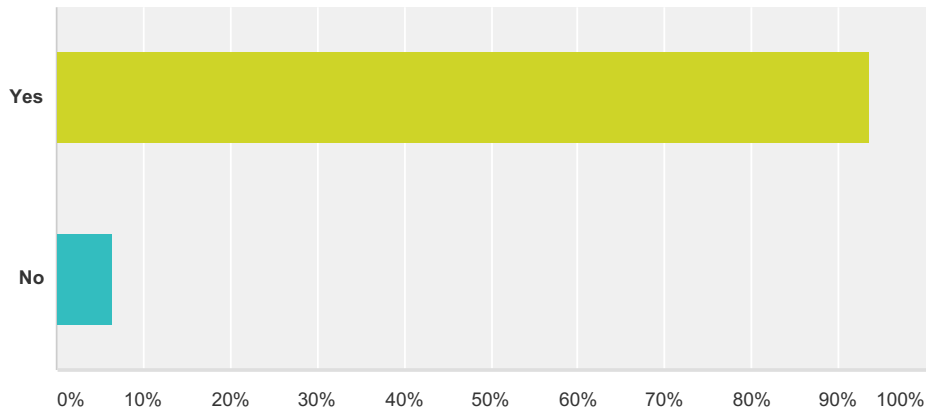
